Sub: Directions under Section 18(1)(b) of Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, regarding Classification of Industries into Red/Orange & Green Category

Whereas, amongst others, under Section 16 (b) of the Water Act 1974, one of the functions of the Central Board is to co-ordinate the activities of the State Boards

Whereas, under Section 16(c) of the Water Act 1974, one of the functions of the Central Board is to provide technical assistance to the State Board

Whereas, it has been brought into notice of the Central Board, that the SPCBs/PCCs are following different criteria for classification of industries into red, green & orange category. This classification is being used by the SPCBs/PCCs for issuance of Consents to industries and inventorization of industries

Whereas, the issue regarding classification of industries was deliberated upon in the 56th Conference of Chairmen & Member Secretaries held on August 31, 2010 and a Working Group comprising of representatives from SPCBs & CPCB was constituted to prepare a consolidated list of industries falling under the Red, Green & Orange category to bring uniformity in classification of industries across the country.

Whereas, the report prepared by the Working group was discussed in the 57th Conference of Chairmen & Member Secretaries of SPCBs/PCCs held in Delhi on 15.09.2011, where in some modifications were proposed.

Whereas, the final Report of the Working Group has been prepared, envisaging the suggestions/observations made in the 57th Conference of Chairmen/ Member Secretaries of SPCBs/PCCs

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers delegated to the Chairman, Central Board, under Section 18(1)(b) of the Water Act , 1974, the following Directions are issued for compliance:

- (a) To maintain uniformity in categorization of industries as red, green and orange, the SPCBs/PCCs shall adopt the list as given at Table 7.3, 7.4 & 7.5

in the enclosed report, for grant of Consent, inventorization of industries in red, green & orange category and other related activities

- (b) The SPCBs/PCCs shall revise the list of red, green and orange category of industries available with them based on the criteria specified in the enclosed report in their State/UT and submit the same to CPCB within 90 days of receipt of this letter. A hard copy as well as soft copy of the same shall be submitted

The report on action taken for compliance of the Directions shall be submitted to CPCB within one month of the receipt of these Directions

Direction under Section 18(1)(b) of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 in the matter of Write Petition (Civil) No 309 of 2003, Laxmi Narain Modi Vs Union of India in the Supreme Court of India on Issues relating to slaughter houses

WHEREAS, amongst others, under Section 17 of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, one of the functions of the State Pollution Control Boards is to plan a comprehensive programme for prevention, control or abatement of pollution of streams and wells in the State and to secure the execution thereof; and

WHEREAS, the slaughter houses generate substantial quality of effluent, which needs to be properly treated before disposal; and

WHEREAS, the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) has been pursuing with the State Pollution Control Boards (SPCBs)/ Pollution Control Committees (PCCs) to take appropriate action so that the slaughter houses meet prescribed norms; and

WHEREAS, information received from SPCBs/PCCs reveals that slaughter house(s) are yet to install proper effluent treatment facility and/or are yet to be covered under consent regime; and

WHEREAS, in the meeting held under the Chairmanship of Secretary, Ministry of Environment & Forests on April 26, 2012 in Paryavaran Bhawan, C.G.O. Complex, New Delhi, it was decided that CPCB would initiate action against all slaughter houses which are not meeting the norms and rules through SPCBs; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in view of the above and exercising the powers conferred under Section 18(1)(b) of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, the following directions are issued to ----- (name of SPCB/PCC) for compliance:

1. The State Board/Committee shall ensure that all slaughter houses operate with valid consent;
2. The State Board/Committee shall take appropriate action so that the slaughter houses provide effluent treatment facility to meet norms; and
3. The State Board/Committee shall take action against defaulting slaughter houses; and
4. The State Board/Committee shall submit six-monthly status reports to CPCB indicating no. of slaughter houses in operation, no. of slaughter houses with effluent treatment facility, no. of slaughter houses with valid consent and actions taken against the defaulting slaughter houses.

Sub: Directions under Section 18 (1) (b) of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, in Case of Processing of Salteless Skins/ Hides in Slaughter Houses/Skin Mandis/ Tanneries – Withdrawn Thereof.

WHEREAS, in view of the concerns related to pollution caused by tannery effluents and the use of salt for preservation of hides and skins, Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) in exercise of the power conferred under Section 18 (1) (b) of the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, issued directions to State Pollution Control Boards (SPCBs)/ Pollution Control Committees (PCCs) regarding processing of Salt-less skins/ hides in Slaughter Houses/ Skin Mandis/ Tanneries vide its communication - Tannery/ General/PCI-SSI/2010/13999-14039 dated February 14, 2011 which required SPCBs and PCCs to obtain time bound Action Plan from the concerned, such as slaughter houses / tanneries etc. to ensure compliance of the following within six months:

- To prohibit preservation of skins/hides with salt
- To prohibit processing of salted skins/ hides in the tannery units located in the state
- To prohibit transportation of salted skins/ hides
- To prohibit salted skins/ hides activities in Mandis/Godowns
- To prohibit import of salted skins/ hides by the tannery units or skin dealers in the state

WHEREAS, in view of the above concerns, the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Dept. of Industrial Policy and Promotion (DIPP) vide their O.M. No. 10/4/11-Leather dated July 25, 2011 constituted a Core Group under the Chairmanship of Secretary (DIPP) to study and recommend measures to minimize the pollution caused by slaughter houses and tannery units;

WHEREAS, in view of the constitution of Core Group by the DIPP, Ministry of Environment & Forests (MoEF) vide letter F.No 17012/1/2011-CPA dated August 4, 2011 conveyed to the CPCB that the time-period given by CPCB in the directions dated February 14, 2011 issued to SPCBs on the use of salt-less technology, be further extended by four months;

WHEREAS, accordingly, CPCB vide its communication - Tannery/ General/PCI-SSI/2010/3996-4036 dated August 17/18, 2011 extended the time-period for compliance of the directions dated February 14, 2011 till December 15, 2011;

WHEREAS, the Core Group, constituted by the DIPP submitted its report and the same was forwarded by DIPP to MoEF vide O.M. No. 10/4/11-Leather dated December 9, 2011. The report has inter-alia suggested/ recommended the following:

- Selection of alternative technological options from the Indian and International experience suitable to different situations in the Indian social context and the raw material supply chain.

- Commissioning of pilot studies with the selected options in appropriate situation in different locations in the country for a period of 1 year.
- There should be active participation of CPCB, CLRI on one hand and slaughter houses, the primary collectors of raw hides and skins, mandis and the tanneries on the other as required by the chosen context.
- The projects may be sponsored by MoEF, DIPP, Ministry of Food Processing and Department of Animal Husbandry, Department of Science and Technology and by the Meat Industry and the Tanning Industry, perhaps on cost sharing basis.
- Outcome of the pilot studies should be carefully analysed and techno-economic and social viability of the systems well established before the recommendation for adoptions in Indian conditions.

WHEREAS, considering and accepting the recommendations of the Core Group and further considering that follow up action on the recommendations of the Core Group would take time, MoEF vide letter F.No 17012/1/2011-CPA dated August 8, 2012 directed CPCB under Section 18 (1) (a) of the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, to withdraw the directions dated February 14, 2011 issued to SPCBs/ PCCs under Section 18 (1) (b) of the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974;

NOW, THEREFORE, the directions issued to SPCBs/PCCs under Section 18 (1) (b) of the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 for processing of Salt-less skins/ hides in Slaughter Houses/ Skin Mandis/ Tanneries vide CPCB communication - Tannery/ General/PCI-SSI/2010/13999-14039 dated February 14, 2011 are hereby withdrawn.

DIRECTIONS UNDER SECTION 18(1)(b) OF THE WATER (PREVENTION AND CONTROL OF POLLUTION ACT, 1974 & THE AIR (PREVENTION AND CONTROL OF POLLUTION) ACT, 1981 IN THE MATTER OF POLLUTION CONTROL IN 17 CATEGORY OF HIGHLY POLLUTING INDUSTRIES

Sir,

WHEREAS, under Section 17(1)(a) of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 one of the functions of the State Pollution Control Boards/Pollution Control Committees is to plan a comprehensive programme for the prevention, control of streams and wells in the State and to secure execution thereof.

WHEREAS, the State Pollution Control Boards/Pollution Control Committees are required to ensure installation and regular operation of the requisite pollution control facilities in the polluting industries.

WHEREAS, State Pollution Control Boards/Pollution Control Committees are also required to ensure that the Handling, Storage and Disposal of Hazardous waste do not cause water and air pollution.

WHEREAS, under Section 16 (1)(b) of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 one of the main function of CPCB is to co-ordinate the activities of State Boards.

WHEREAS, complete information on the adequacy and operational status of the pollution control facilities in 17 categories of highly industries is required to be compiled by SPCBs/PCCs and submitted to CPCB on half yearly basis.

WHEREAS, the compiled information is required to furnish replies to Parliament Questions, CAG queries and other related correspondence with MoEF. The information is also required by CPCB for planning inspections under ESS (Environmental Surveillance Squad).

WHEREAS, CPCB has earlier issued Directions dated July 19, 2002 on the subject to all the SPCBs/PCCs. As per the directions, the status of the highly polluting industries is to be submitted on six monthly basis to CPCB. Several reminders in this regard were sent by CPCB to SPCBs/PCCs, the last reminder is dated February 29, 2012.

WHEREAS, the desired information on the 17 categories of highly polluting industries in _____ State has not been submitted to CPCB after _____.

WHEREAS CAG, in its comments on report No.3B of 2001, has raised objections regarding non-submission of updated status of 17 Category of industries by SPCBs/PCCs to CPCB (Annexure I).

WHEREAS, it is observed in many cases that the industries do not operate the pollution control system on regular basis and in some cases even the existing facilities are inadequate.


Now, therefore in exercise of the power conferred under Section 18(1)(b) of Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution Act, 1974 & the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 and keeping in view that any improper management and handling of the hazardous waste may also cause Air and Water pollution, the following directions are issued for compliance to the State Pollution Control Board:


- (i) That updated status of all the large and medium scale industries falling under the highly polluting 17 categories, including action taken against the defaulters, in your state in the format given in Annexure II shall be submitted to CPCB.
- (ii) The information has to be submitted on six monthly basis to CPCB as per the previous directions. The reports are to be submitted on six monthly basis starting from the report of January to June 2012 to be submitted within 15 days of the receipt of the directions followed by the reports for July to December 2012 to be sent by January 15, 2013. 			<p>1. MoEF, Govt. of India issued a notification on January 16, 1991 to ensure compliance of environmental standards in polluting industries. In above programme, 17 Categories of highly polluting industries were finalised for regular follow up through CPCB. List is enclosed as Annexure-I.</p> <p>2. The vigil over these highly polluting industries is being kept by concerned State Pollution Control Boards and the status of medium and large units of above categories received from various SPCBs/PCCs, is being compiled by CPCB and sent regularly to MoEF on half yearly basis. Latest status is enclosed as Annexure-II.</p> <p>3. As regards polluting units other than 17 Categories (i.e. Red Categories of Industries) State Pollution Control Boards have been asked to prepare updated list. This matter was also discussed in all the Chairman & Member Secretaries Conference of all SPCBs/PCCs held on 31st August, 2010. As the SPCBs/PCCs have their own list of Red Categories of Industries therefore, it was decided in the Conference that a national level consolidated list should be prepared.</p> <p>4.
